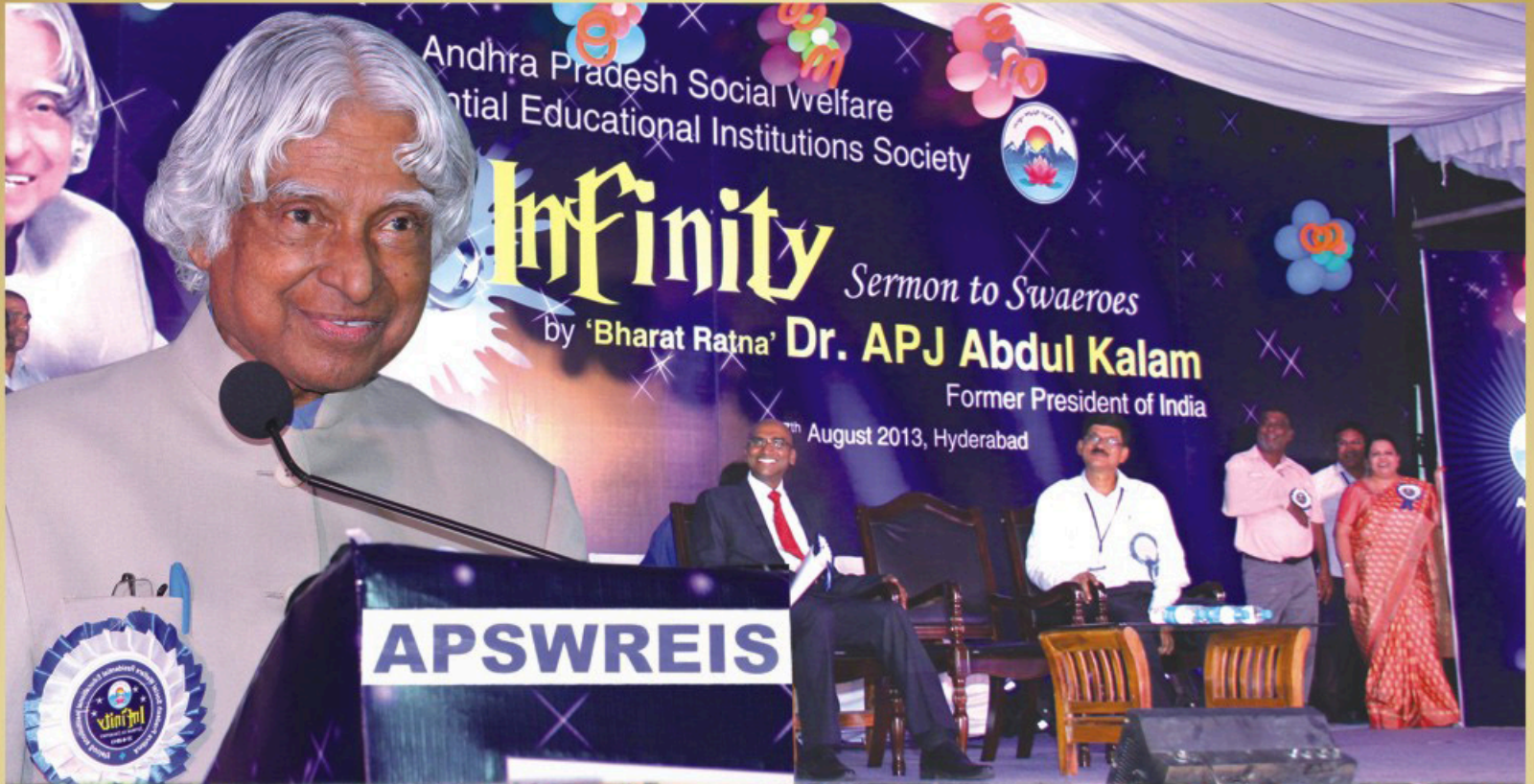

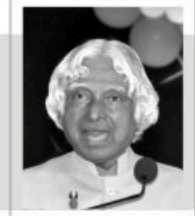

I suggest it's hard work. If you have this, you'll become what you want.



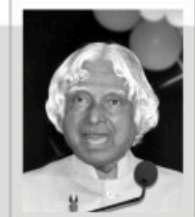

### **Tell us something about your nativity and childhood.**

I was born in an agriculture family, in Atmakur village, Warangal dist. My parents are Sarojana and Bhaskar.

I have a sister and a brother. Being the eldest, my mother used to make me work on land, and she also used to make me work for wages, during vacation.

### **What about your primary education?**

I studied from 1st to 10<sup>th</sup> in govt. schools in Atmakur itself. I missed many classes working on land. But I used gather notes from the cleverest students and learn. I had great zeal for learning from childhood.

### **How did you happen to join SW residential school?**

One of my father's friends was a teacher of APSWRS/JC, Jakaram, Warangal. With his help, I joined that Jr. College in 1998 through an entrance test, and took BPC.

### **How did you work to get into medicine?**

My only goal and dream was 'medicine'. So I used to prepare for it from Intermediate itself. I used to gather information and relevant material for Eamcet. Finally I succeeded in getting admission into Bachelor of Physiotherapy through counseling at Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, in the year 2000.

### **How was your journey as a student?**

It was a struggle, believe me! I couldn't afford to buy books. I used to depend on friends and on libraries for notes. I also used to labour for wages for personal expenditure. That's how I completed both BPT and MPT (ortho). I did my BPT from Kakatiya college Physiotherapy at Warangal; and MPT from NIMS

University, Rajasthan in 2012 as an in-service scholar.

### **What are you doing now?**

I now work in the Orthopedic department, Gandhi Hospital, Hyd.

### **I believe you are planning to establish a corporate hospital yourself. How's it going?**

I've established 'Sparsha poly clinic' at RTC x Roads, in collaboration with Dr. Jaya Shankar, BPT, MD who's also an alumnus of Thoguta. We're now planning to build (labour rooms) a Multi specialty hospital of our own.

### **As an alumnus of APSWREIS, how do you wish to contribute your part?**

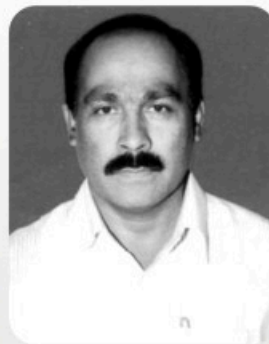
I'm very grateful to APSWREI Society for, it helped me to attain my goal. My first patient was an orphan. I treated all age group patients and of different diseases. # Technique in Multiplicaton Tables

A student remembers 1 to 10 multiplication tables easily. He feels difficult to remember beyond the 10th table. So I introduce a new technique to remember the tables, even beyond the 10th table, easily. The technique can be divided into 2 types. To understand this technique let us once again recollect what is a multiplicand, a multiplier and a multiple

Eg.  $3 \times 8 = 24$   
 here 3 is multiplicand  
 8 is multiplier  
 24 is multiple

## TYPE ONE :

If this technique is applied to 8th table, the student will get 18th table. If it is applied to 1st, 2nd, 3rd..... tables, the student will get 11th, 12th, 13th..... tables respectively.

Let us learn this technique by applying to 8th table. This technique can be divided into 3 steps.

### **Step : 1**

The multiplier of the 8th table should be added to the ten's place of the multiple. let it be 'A'

### **Step : 2**

Let the units place of the multiple of the 8th table be 'B'.

### **Step : 3**

When 'A' is kept in the ten's place, and 'B' in units place, then the result will be the multiple of the 18th Table.

These 3 steps can also be explained as shown below.

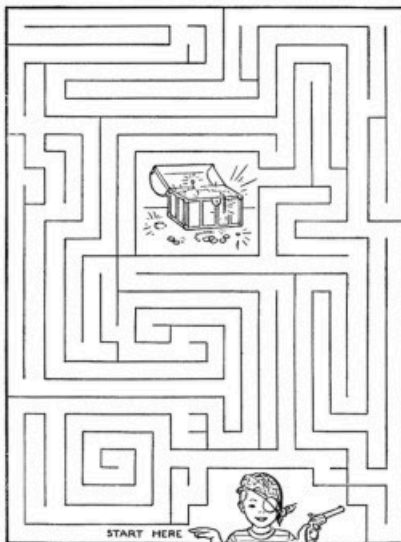

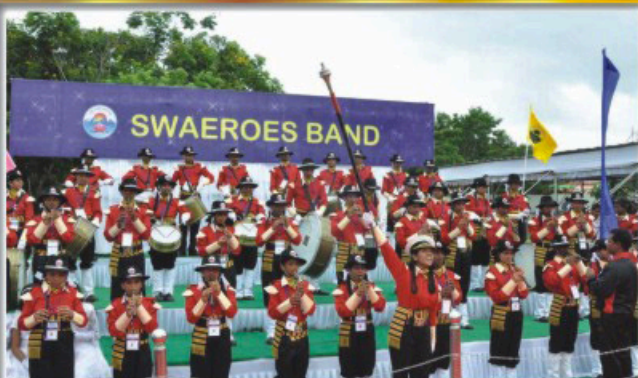
"If at all I'm free, it's only today sir" spoke Sri. C. Siddhardhana Reddy looking at Secretary.

## Vice Chairman with 14<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission

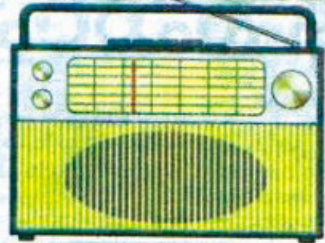

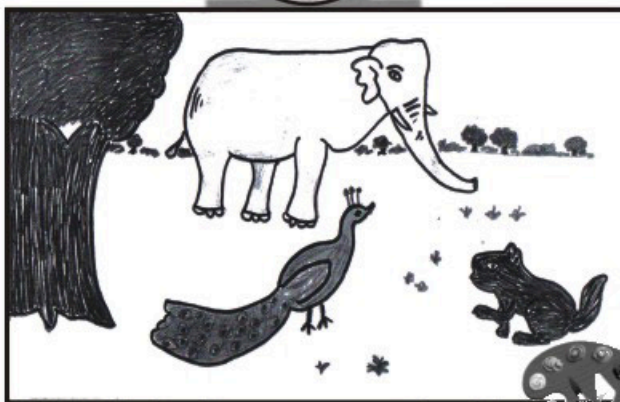

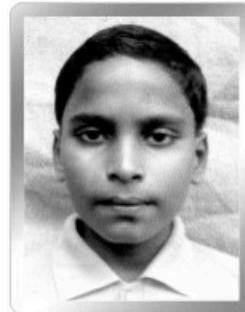
I don't need to study in private colleges. A.P.S.W.R. Schools are better today than the private schools.

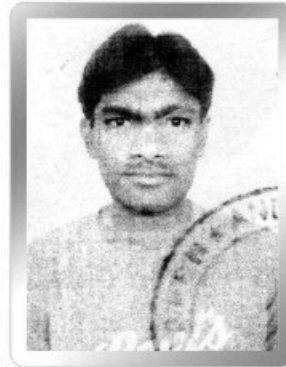

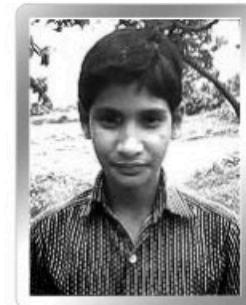

### III. Preparing for Exams

- A. Keep in mind that you want to be an active learner, not a passive one. The more you use and manipulate the information, the better you will understand it. Using and manipulating information in as many ways as possible also maximizes your ability to access your memory.
- B. **Do not wait until the night before an exam to study!** Of course, you should be regularly reviewing your notes, but the preparation still takes time.
- C. If your instructor hasn't explained to you how he or she designs exams, ask. This is a perfectly legitimate concern. However, keep in mind that an instructor has the right to design exams in whatever fashion he or she sees fit, and in most cases you have no business asking for changes in that design. You need to learn to handle all testing styles--including the dreaded essay exam!
- D. A good first step in preparation is to read through your notes a couple of times. While you are doing this, you might also
1. Highlight major topics and subtopics, with the goal of generating an outline of your notes. Even if you take your notes in outline form, this is a good practice. Major topics often extend through more than one day's lecture, and it is easy to lose track of the overall picture from day to day.
  2. With a second color, highlight all vocabulary terms.
- E. Outline the entire set of notes. When you study a large body of information, you should study **from concept to detail**, not the other way around. It will, in fact, be much easier to learn the details if you take

the time to learn the concept and theory first. **The least efficient approach to studying is to attempt to memorize your notes from beginning to end. It's not the words which are important--it's the ideas.**

- F. Consider ways of dealing with the information other than those used in class. The more ways you can manipulate and experience the material you are trying to learn, the more secure your understanding and memory will be.

**Some suggestions:**

1. Make **charts, diagrams** and **graphs**.
2. Make **lists**.
3. If the subject matter includes structures, practice **drawing** those structures.

Remember that a drawing is useless unless the important structures are labeled.

- G. There are almost always types of information which you will have to memorize (eg. vocabulary). No one has ever invented a better device for memorizing than **flash cards**.
- H. One of the most universally effective ways to polish off your study activities is to prepare a **self test**.

1. Challenge yourself as severely as you can.
  2. As you are studying, keep a running collection of "exam questions." If you seriously attempt to write difficult and meaningful questions, by the time you finish you will have created a formidable exam. When you begin to feel you're ready for your instructor's exam, take out your questions and see if you can answer them. If you can't, you may need to go back and reinforce some of the things you are trying to learn.
- I. **Never, ever pull an "All-Nighter"** on the night before an exam. This is a "freshman trick," meaning that good students learn very quickly that it is futile. What you may gain from extra study time won't compensate for the loss of alertness and ability to concentrate due to lack of sleep.

**J. On exam day:**

1. Try not to "cram" during every spare moment before an exam. This only increases the feeling of desperation which leads to panic, and then to test anxiety. You may find it useful, on the night before an exam, to jot down a few ideas or facts which you wish to have fresh in your mind when you begin the exam. Read through your list a couple of times when you get up in the morning and/or just before you take the exam, then put it away. This kind of memory reinforcement not only improves your performance on the test, it also improves your long-term memory of the material.
2. Be physically prepared.
  - a. Get a good night's sleep.
  - b. This may seem silly, but **go to the bathroom** just before the exam. Don't expect your teacher to let you leave to do this during the test! The tension which generally goes along with taking an exam may increase the need to perform this physical activity, so you may need to go, even though you don't particularly feel like it.

Time plus energy equals learning. Allocating realistic amount of time means effective learning for students and effective teaching for faculty. Therefore be in class on time.

Many roads lead to learning. Different students have different talents and styles of learning. Students brilliant in a seminar might be all thumbs shown in a lab or studies. Students need opportunities to show their talents and learn in ways that work for them. So, co-operate with the students, understand their ways and be a mentor.

Lack of interest on the part of the teacher leads to lack of interest on the part of the student. Teacher should be approachable and re-teach, when necessary. So treat the students in a fair and equitable manner.

Finally I would like to tell that “good teaching – produces students who excel accordingly. A good teacher can inspire hope, ignite the imagination and instill a love for learning. Of all the hard jobs around, one of the hardest is being a good teacher. Hence as Dalai Lama the Buddhist monk has rightly said “when educating the minds of youth do not forget to educate their hearts”.
