BREAK IT LIKE BALRAM

AP22 A And

enavath Balaram Naik was born on 29th July, 1980 in Keshianayak thanda located on the outskirts of Thirumalagiri village in Balanagar mandal of Mahaboobnagar district in Andhra Pradesh. His parents, Hunya Naik and Kesley were the personification of hardships. They had a meager land of two to three acres which was all barren. Both his parents were manual labourers. Balaram was the eldest of the six brothers and a sister.

Balaram's elementary education was done in a poor rural school away from his *thanda*. For his upper primary education, he had to walk down to a school in Pedda Revathi. When he was in IV Standard, his father migrated to Hyderabad and

transformed into a rickshaw puller. However, Balaram had to stay back in thanda to be looked after by his granny. Every day, it was his duty to fetch water from a nearby well, and firewood from distant jungle. For secondary education, along with a few of his pals, he left for Jadcherla to study in a Zilla Parishad High school. Here, he was put up in a welfare hostel where his admission

proved to be an arduous task. Yet, he says, "I worked hard and got through SSC in 1996 with first class marks and also stood first in the class. There was a lot of motivation from my teachers and it made me come out."

But his delight did not stand long. Later, he went off to Hyderabad where his father had already been pulling life with a rickshaw. He joined Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Junior College at *Bagh*

> Lingampally. With a great difficulty he got admission into MPC. Owing to miserable conditions of life, his attention on studies was diluted and so he failed in his first year examinations. He lost only his examination but not his hope. He changed his group to CEC and passed privately in the year 1999. But life gave him a different twist here. Soon after I year of intermediate education, being meekly compelled by his family members, he got wed to have a consanguineous wife. The troubles got doubled. He had to come to the rescue of his rickshaw pulling father. So during scorching summers, he incarnated himself as *a cooli in an*



attire of lungi and towel and stood at labour-adda and managed to get work at construction sites in Golnaka, Nallakunta and Vidyanagar areas.

These troubles recall a painful experience of his childhood faced by him when he was in his village. His father had confiscated him to a contractor to work for 30 days. The work mainly consisted of sieving the sand, mixing cement and carrying it to the construction site. Having worked for 30 continuous days till late in the evening, he got splitting cracks over his heels. His mother would apply turmeric paste over the cracks. After all this, to the utter shock of every one, the conceited contractor declined full payment. This left a deep mark on the child. He thought he should never do such labour work again, but destiny did not allow him to get rid of this work. But he did not allow destiny to deter his studies.

Labour on one side, studies on the other. Now that he finished his Intermediate, he joined B.R. Ambedkar's Open University at *Kachiguda* study centre to do B.A with EPP as specialization. During this time, they all resided in a small house in *Golnaka* by paying a rent of Rs. 450 per month. The burden was twofold: of studies and of the family. Since he had classes only on Saturdays and Sundays, *he purchased an auto with a loan sanctioned to him under the PMRY Scheme and he plied it nearly for four years.* Again, he failed in one subject. The reason for his poor performance in examination can be easily guessed. Somehow, after a lapse of one year, he passed out the examinations with second class marks. Now, it was a matter of pride for him because he was one among the three from his *thanda* who completed graduation.

His success in graduation and his life in Hyderabad prompted him to go for coaching in *civil services at AP Study Circle*. But, he learnt that the minimum requirement for this coaching at AP Study Circle was post graduation. So he took admission into M.A. in Public Personal Management (PPM) as a private candidate and with unflinching determination finished it. During this period he had an idea that he should also learn English. The Ramakrishna Mission in Hyderabad was at his disposal. *What's more he attended spoken English classes.* He said it is the Ramakrishna Mission that developed discipline and positive attitude in him.

Like an indefatigable warrior, he went on to prosecute M.Phil. He appeared for the entrance examination along with 40 regular students of M.A. To the surprise of everyone, Balaram was the only candidate to get qualified for M.Phil and by seriously working for two years, he finished M.Phil during 2006-2008. While doing his M.Phil, he also wrote the UGC-NET and got through it successfully. What should we call his spirit for learning!

His heart went again for preparation of civil services examination. He started seriously preparing for **Union Public** *Service Commission (UPSC)* and qualified only for Mains in 2008. Can we expect him to give up? No, he never did. He attempted for the second time, called for Interview and yes, he dream has come true. He turned out to be a successful candidate in *Indian Revenue Services (IRS).* Your heart sinks to know that

he missed his IPS just with one single mark. Yet he was not disappointed for his long journey of ups and downs, his trials and tribulations taught him not to be disappointed but to be contented with the big IRS.

At any juncture if he had weakened his heart because his father was a rickshaw-puller and mother a manual labourer; or because he was born in a distant rustic thanda; or because he has many an illiterate sibling to be taken care of; or because he had to marry even when he was in intermediate; or because he was unsuccessful (failed) twice in his examinations, would he have come up in his life with flying colours to be seated on the throne of success with a not-so-easily attainable goal of IRS? Would he have stood tall among the people of his community, for that matter among his villagers, unless it is for the steely strength of mind, perseverance and achievement? Yes, it is these that made him an Assistant Commissioner of Customs, Central Excise, Service Tax and Narcotics. *An incredible success story, isn't it*?

At the success of his son, his father says, "We are too innocent to understand his success. One thing we know is he got the best of jobs. My other sons too are educated. We are now leading a happy life."

Kudos! Balaramji kudos!

N.B: And as a man who has seen different facets of life, he hasn't stopped here. He goes back to the poor and illiterate, he goes back to his village, his hostel, convenes meetings, and conducts medical camps with all humility. Last but not least he wishes to serve the APTWREIS taking his cue from our Secretary.

Dr. K. Rambabu was a cute little boy who got admitted in 5th class at kallur, SWR school, in Khammam district. His sparkling eyes were indicative of a promising student.

He gave appointment at 4 pm, I reached his hospital at 3:45 pm, I dared not enter his room. It was so crowded. Many patients were waiting for his 'darshan'.

After soothing all the anxious patients he invited me in to his room with a smile. Though he is a famous doctor, he looked like a kid to me. On seeing me all his reminiscences of his struggles for education surfaced out.

Incidentally I came to know that his spouse. Dr. Aruna too is a Swaero and I took a chance to greet them both and had a long conversation which I'm sure will delight the readers.

Sridhar: Could you tell us about your nativity and family?

Dr. Rambabu: I am a native of Meenavolu Village in Yerrupalem Mandal, of Khammam-Dist. My father was a farmer, he is no more. I have a brother and a sister. My wife is also a SWAERO. She is also a doctor. We have a daughter and a son.

Dr. Aruna: I studied I - IV Classes at My native Village, Valluripalli, in Thadepalli gudem Mandal.

Sridhar: what about your primary school education?

Dr.Rambabu: I studied up to 4th class in my native village,

Meenavolu.

Sridhar: Where and how did you happen to join SWR school?

Dr. Rambabu: I wrote the admission test for admission in APSWR School (Boys) Kalluru, I got the seat and studied there up to 10th class. I then got admission in APSWRS/JC (Boys) Palvoncha, and studied Intermediate there with Bi.P.C Group.

Dr. Aruna: I got admission in APSWR School/Jr.college(Girls), Polasanapalli, West Godavari District. I studied there from V to Intermediate. My father was very particular to see me as a doctor.

Sridhar: How did you get into medicine? Who was your inspiration?

Dr. Rambabu: I couldn't get a seat in medicine in the first attempt. I went to KORA, Nellore for long term Eamcet Coaching, I got the seat in MBBS in ASRAMS, Eluru in 2001, I completed the course in 2007. My mother is my inspiration. She instilled in me the strong desire to become a Doctor. I was inspired by the motivation given to me by the principal Sri P. Bharath Babu, and Physics lecturer Sri Mallareddy sir, who took classes separately early in the morning and gave very useful notes.

Dr. Aruna: I wrote EAMCET for admission into MBBS course, but I could not get a seat. So I joined in B.Sc. But I was very eager to go for Medicine. So I discontinued my B.Sc. Course in Second year and went to Nellore, to take long term EAMCET coaching at 'Rathnam'. I got a seat in ASRAMS Eluru, and successfully completed MBBS Course. My husband Dr. K. Rambabu, was also studying in the same college. But we didn't know each other. Our parents arranged our marriage after he got a seat in M.S (Gen. Surgery).

Sridhar: Do you believe that SWR had laid a strong foundation for your growth? Could you elaborate?

Dr. Rambabu: Yes "MY MOTHER GAVE ME BIRTH AND THE SOCIAL WELFARE RESIDENTIALS GAVE ME LIFE". There I was taught to face all the challenges of life bravely; I studied in these institutions from 5th to Intermediate. Since 8th class my mother used to encourage me to become a doctor. Her encouragement turned into a burning ambition in me. All the needed

psychological strength and confidence was instilled in me by the staff. The then principal Sri Isaac Babu and Sri Upender sir were always guiding me throughout my career.

Sridhar: How was your journey as a medico?

Dr. Rambabu: In MBBS I studied well, but due to poor financial background I suffered a lot. I had to manage myself with tiffins instead of meals at night being unable to pay for my expenses. I fell sick due to insufficient diet. The text books were very costly. I had to borrow these books from my friends. I used to read these books while they were sleeping. In the beginning I could not do well in Examinations, because of lack of sufficient Knowledge in English. I felt embarrassed. I could not answer questions in physiology properly. I had to work very hard to cope up with the vast syllabus. I completed MBBS successfully. In PG entrance test I got a seat in Neuro surgery but I wished to do PG in General Surgery, so I waited for some months until I got a seat in General surgery at RMC, Kakinada.

Sridhar: How did you happen to know Rambabu, madam?

Dr. Aruna: He's from Khammam and I'm from West Godavari. We never knew each other until I joined in the Alluri Seetharamaraju medical college. He was three years senior to me. It was here that he saw me but never proposed. My uncle, Dr. Jayaraju was a professor and HOD of Ophthalmology there. He felt that both of us would make a good pair, spoke to the elders and arranged the wedding.

Sridhar: Any regrets for marrying him?

Dr. Aruna: No, never. We are happy and comfortable. We have two kids too. Life is fine.

Sridhar: Dr. Ramababugaru, what have you to say about Dr. Aruna?

Dr. Rambabu: Oh, she's sweet-tempered. She's also hard working and under standing. It's easy getting along with her.

Sridhar: Dr. Aruna garu, what have you tell about him?

Dr. Aruna: He's simply superb. Life is smooth with him in spite of petty quibbles. He's a good father to his children. That's what I like in him.

Sridhar: What are you doing now and how do you fare in the profession?

Dr. Rambabu: Now I am the top surgeon in Madhira town, conducting 50-60 surgeries every month, I am conducting free medical camps and I take least amount of fee for surgeries.

Dr. Aruna: Now we have established a hospital in Madhira where we work together. We are conducting free medical camps in villages for the sake of poor people.

Sridhar: What is your opinion about forming 'SWAEROES' Association? How do you wish to contribute to it?

Dr. Rambabu: It's a great Idea to form "The SWAEROES' Association. It helps us in maintaining rapport with all SWAEROES. I contributed Rs.12000/- for buying T-Shirts for SWAEROES.



Sridhar: Are you in touch with other Swaeroes and do you try to inspire them?

Dr.Rambabu: I wish to be in touch with all SWAEROES by conducting medical camps in SW institutions.

Sridhar: What's your message to the current SWAEROES?

Dr. Rambabu: If a generation of SWAEROES supports the present SWAEROES it will be very beneficial for the next generation. My background always warned me, not to neglect my studies. Our SWAEROES need proper motivation, In their teenage. Set a goal and work for it with perseverance. My Education helped in saving my mother from breast Cancer. If we are well educated we can serve not only our family but also the entire society.

Dr. Aruna: There is rat - race competition in every walk of life. So we have to work very hard to be ahead of others.

Sridhar: What is your opinion about forming 'SWAEROES' Association? How do you wish to contribute to it?

Dr.Rambabu: It's a great Idea to form "The SWAEROES' Association. It helps us in maintaining rapport with all SWAEROES. I contributed Rs.12000/- for buying T-Shirts for SWAEROES

Dr. Aruna: I am eager to share my experiences with present SWAEROES. I have already visited APSWRS/JC(G), Kalluru and Palvoncha. I wish to guide them on a continuous basis to realize their dreams.

TIPS TO TOP

IN THE EXAMS WITH FULL CONFIDENCE AND POSITIVE ATTITUDE

- Study regularly and note the very IMP points.
- Write at least one Para daily.
- Avoid using sketches and prefer only pencil for borders, underlines etc.
- Prefer 4 side border keeping more space in the left side.
- Always remember to write the page numbers on all the pages.
- Never forget to write the Question number for all the answers that you write and attempt to write.
- Use the capital letters at the beginning of the sentence and remember to put the full stop at the end of the sentence.
- Avoid using the 'Definite Article'- 'THE' before proper Nouns unless required in the exceptional cases.
- Answer all the Questions as per the instructions given. Write the choice Questions under the Caption CHOICE.
- SSC E.M., English Choice is there only in Pr.2 supplementary Questions. Under set A & B only 5 Questions are to be answered choosing 2 from S.A. & 3 from S.B. or vice versa.
- Answer the Questions which fetch you the full marks first and then think of other Questions which you do not have much confidence-but try to attempt all.

- Always be up to the mark and write only the answer which is pertinent/relevant. Don't write more or less. The marks allotted must be kept in your mind before answering the Questions.
- Hand writing must be legible. Maintain gaps between words, lines, sentences & paras so as to make your presentation very impressive.
- Avoid scribbling. If any mistake committed may be stricken off with one straight line only.
- Avoid writing slogans, names of gods & goddesses as it gives wrong and unwanted indications.
- Plan your timing properly.
- Keep at least 5 mts time at your disposal for verifying your answers and completing the formalities.

BEFORE, DURING & THE EXAMS AFTER

- Don't over strain yourself before the Exams
- Take light food only during the Exams. Avoid spicy food.
- Take utmost care about your health during the Exams.
- Avoid unnecessary discussions.
- Keep silence for 2 mts before answering the Question Paper.
- Don't waste your time discussing the answers of the Question paper of the Exam already completed.
