hen India was passing through a critical phase of freedom struggle in 1940s, a poor man was also battling against poverty for the survival of his wife and 11 children. The poor man was Late Sri Pagidipati Rathnam of Qilashapur, a village near Jangaon. Even though he was leading a miserable life, he was not without dreams for his children. He did not want his children to work in agricultural fields. As a man of forethought, he sent all his children to school.

The youngest of the 11 kids is Mr. Devaiah. He always stood first in class. He gained a great reputation when he stood one among the top ten students in HSC examination in the Telangana region. Unable to manage a living, his father admitted Devaiah in a Social Welfare Hostel. He was 9 years old. The hostel was lacking the basic amenities. The inmates sometimes went without food due to inadequate supply of food items. This usually had

an adverse effect on the studies of the inmates. But Devaiah felt undeterred, worked hard and continued to excel in studies. He had to bear with all the hardships until he finished his M.B.B.S from the prestigious Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad in 1971. Those years were significant in the life of Dr.Devaiah which paved way for a broad outlook in life. He learnt a lot from the living conditions of his friends, fellow students and the community people.

He remembers his high school headmaster, Sri Subbarao garu, who made an indelible impression on his mind. The headmaster would request the teachers to support the poor and the needy students. Inspired by his message the teachers started extra instructional hours after school. "This head master became my role-model for my future life. It is he who advised me to go for medicine. I took his advice as his commandment," says Dr. Devaiah.

After attaining his degree in Medicine, Dr.Devaiah had two alternatives: to pursue higher education or to support his family with some job. He decided to take on the responsibility of bread winner and it was a must for him too. The Prestigious Kakatiya Medical College offered him a job in 1971 and he readily accepted it only to meet the basic needs of the life. His life took a dramatic turn when he tied the sacred knot to one Rudrama Devi in 1973. It was an ideal social marriage. The couple was a perfect model. As an academician, Dr. Devaiah tapped the inherent potentials of his wife and encouraged her to pursue the higher studies. She was equally determined to go for medical profession, an astonishing thing to think of in those days from womenfolk.

This fantastic couple was blessed with three children who



were mainly brought up by Rudrama Devi's parents. He went to pursue his Post Graduation in America first and then for a training in Anesthesiology at Harvard Medical School's Children Hospital, Boston. After gaining an adequate experience and expertise in the field of medicine, Dr.Devaiah started teaching at the University of Tennessee in Le Bonheur Children's hospital. During this time, his wife finished her training in Pathology from Baptist Memorial hospital in 1991. Having worked for a certain period, Dr. Devaiah, was fed up with hectic medical practice, took retirement in 1994 and conveniently moved to Florida (USA).

Thereafter the couple established 'Sun Coast Laboratory' in Florida employing over 100 people. He launched an offshore BPO operation called 'Anion Health Care' in Hyderabad with 200 employees. The success in these projects prompted him further to start a health insurance company called 'Freedom Health' in Florida along with his children. Within five years of time, Freedom Health has expanded employing some 250 employees and bagged the prestigious awards. This great accomplishment drew the attention of the health insurance experts. Dr. Rudrama Devi started 'Sun Coast Lab' in Florida also in 1995 which goes for blood, urine and other such pathology tests.

Though rolling in luxuries and prosperity, Dr. Devaiah's heart ached for the service to the poor and the oppressed. The very thought of serving the poor filled his heart. Never forgetting his humble origins and helping hands, he launched 'NAADAM' (National Association for

Advancement of Dalits, Adivasis & Minorities), a non-profit organization in 1979 which aims at large to uplift and upgrade the Dalits in Education, Employment and Economic equality.

He says, "Is there any way to pay back to the society is what I always asked myself. If a country is to be developed in all fronts, all the communities should be developed. When 'my people' are in the crushing poverty, my choice was automatic and spontaneous."

NAADAM supports weaker section students to pursue their higher education goals in the country's premier professional colleges like IIT, NIT and IIIT. "In pursuit of our dreams, we never forgot the typical Dalit women who still need empowerment and education. We also extended our hands for the rural social infrastructure development, especially keeping in view of the girl







children. I have not missed my hometown in these service activities."

His wife also loves her profession considering it as one of the noblest professions. Even at this age she spends a few hours managing the service activities of our organizations in India. Dr. Devaiah humbly confesses that his wife, his in-laws, his children, his well-wishers and above all his godfather Subba Rao garu were all part of his success story.

He says that he came into contact with the APSWREIS through Sri. K. Madhava Rao, IAS and enquired him of the AP Government's projects and policies to serve the socially underprivileged sections of the society and got a comprehensive list of the services rendered by the Social Welfare Department to the Dalits and the ST's. Kaki Madhava Rao had also mentioned about Dr.R.S Praveen Kumar, IPS and his marvelous dedication for the underprivileged through social welfare residential schools.

Dr. Devaiah says, "At first I was surprised to see an IPS officer serving in the field of education. But it was a sheer coincidence that Dr. R.S. Praveen Kumar invited me and my wife to grace the celebrations of the 25th anniversary of the APSWRS at Chillakur in Nellore district. Obviously, I did not want to miss this

opportunity to see a devoted person to uplift Dalits through the APSWREIS. We graced the occasion and felt very excited. Later on I spared my time to see the activities of a few APSWR Schools and concluded that these schools render maximum scope for the all-round development of the oppressed classes when compared to the general SC, ST and BC hostels."

Talking about the Secretary's ideology and dedication, he says, "Dr. R.S Praveen Kumar is unique. I understand that he is trying his best to build up self confidence levels and boost the morale of these students. I have never come across any bureaucrat who is as honest and committed as Dr.R.S.Praveen Kumar. Kudos to his divine endeavors!

Passing a valuable message to Swaeroes he says, "Always think big and aim high. A weak desire cannot produce great results. Dream a bright future but you should toil yourself day and night to make that dream come true. Only hard work can make your life a bed of roses. Don't forget that your attitude is your altitude. May success go in all walks of your life. Good luck to you all."

Well, that is the spirit of Dr. Devaiah.

The SWREIS in Jubilation over SSC/Intermediate Results

Congratulations

he wards of Andhra Pradesh Social Welfare Residential Education Society are in celebration mood after the declaration of SSC and Intermediate public examination results. The staff and students of all the Society institutions are upbeat because of the positive symptoms for English medium education on one side and for attaining the expected results on the other. The following is the brief information on the results declared for academic year 2013-14 pertaining to the 281 Social Welfare residential schools and colleges across the state.



SSC Results:

Out of the 19,856 students who appeared for the examinations 18,099 have come out successfully. The result secured by the Society this year is 91.15 as against 88.62 of the state average. The number of students that got A1 and A2 grades is 580 and 2725 respectively. There are 60 schools which secured 100% results.

Intermediate I Year Results:

Out of the 15,900 students who appeared for the examinations, 11,137 students successfully passed out in the examinations. The state general average is 55.84%. But the average in the Society colleges is as high as 70.04%. However, only 15 colleges were successful in procuring cent percent results.





Intermediate II Year Results:

Out of the 14,784 students who appeared for the examinations, 12,573 students successfully got through the examinations. While the state general average is 65.57%, the Society colleges are successful in securing the average of 85.04% for its students which means a vast difference of 19.47%. The 34 colleges were successful in procuring cent percent results.


MY BEAUTIFUL SCHOOL

I am *Ujwala* of 10th class. *The name of my school is APSWRS/Jr.college Nirmal*. The atmosphere in which our school is situated is very pleasant. It is surrounded by a play ground on one side and Sri ram sagar project on other




side. The school is a twostoried building. The ground floor rooms in the back building are used for different purposes such as the Principal's Office, Library, the Clerk's Office, the Science Laboratory, the Teachers' Common-room, etc. There are twenty teachers, a PET, a librarian, a clerk, karate teacher, dance n craft teacher and peons in our school. All the teachers are qualified and experienced. The Principal Mrs. Suvarna Latha is a learned woman. She teaches English. She won Best Principal Award in Zone V for her meritorious services.

The total number of students of our school is about five hundred and seventy five. The school functions from 9.00A.M. to 4.30 P.M. Classes begin after a mass prayer. During the recess hour we go to play ground. Some students also go to library and read newspaper there. In games period we play football, volley ball, etc. We have disciplined study hours in the morning and also during nights. The library of our school is a big one. There are about two thousand books on different subjects; we have a library period in our weekly routine. We borrow books from our library and refund them after a week. We have regular Parents meetings on every second Sunday







We observe the Republic Day, the Independence Day, the Teacher's Day in our school. We also hold debate competitions and games and sports every year. Many of our students won prizes and medals from zonal and state levels in volley ball, science fair, Ignite Quiz competition. We also participated in Independence Day and Republic day in Police Parade Grounds Hyd in 2012 and 2014 and got 2nd Prize in "Bharatheeyam".


makes for our overall development as an individual and as a good student.

My children speak high of their Secretary. I want to see him and thank him for all his goodness.





rivani has been promoted to 9th class. She has been studying in APSWRS, Medchal right from her 6th class. She finds an opportunity to join 'Voice 4 Girls' camp at Isnapur, Medak dist. This camp is scheduled to run from 19th May to 4th June. Her parents Mrs. Renuka and Mr. Meda Sanjeeva take her to admit her in the camp. Both the parents chat with 'Swaeroes' and exchange a few views.

SWAEROES

Where do you come from?

We are from Sainagar hamlet near Bachupalli village in RR dist. I'm Sanjeev, a social worker. I'm also a spokesman of MRPS.

Why are you both here?

My daughter says that she has to attend this camp for 15 days. So we have brought her here. We also want to know what exactly this camp is about.



What has your daughter told you about it Renukagaru?

Sir, I'm illiterate. I work as a cook in a hostel. My daughter said that it's something useful for girls. My son, Pavan also studies in SWRS, Shaikpet. He too explained to me about it.

What else did your son speak to you about our activities this year?

He said a lot. He spoke about many competitions. He got a prize for winning chess game.

How do you feel hearing that?

Oh, then I guessed that it's some program to enlighten the girls over their personal problems.

Exactly. You're intelligent. Is it worth alerting them over their personal problems?

Of course, it is. It's wonderful. I'm surprised that such care is taken. They take it seriously when teachers deal. The children take us light and easy, and sometimes don't pay attention to what we say. I'm really astonished at the very idea of it.

Hi Srivani, do you like to really attend this V 4 G camp or has someone enforced it over you?

None. I am interested in attending it myself. My parents too are interested in bringing me here. I've explained to my parents how useful it is. I've brought them here so that they know exactly what it is. I want them to know that we are learning something new and useful even during summer vacation.

So, you've heard what your daughter says Mr. Sanjeevgaru. What's your opinon about it?

It's a brilliant idea. I first was doubtful about it. But when I see so many students and teachers, I think there's something worth going here. Or else, Praveen sir will not encourage such camps. I know him personally very well. He's truly interested in the growth of the children. Now I understand what V 4 G camp is about. It's a need for girls.

What language do your children speak at home?

They normally converse in Telugu. But they also speak English. I feel proud when they speak English. My son wrote an English poem for 'Swaeroes' magazine. I saw it there with his photo. I'm really proud! He got 412 marks in first year MPC. I'm sure he has a fine future.

What else would you like to share, Sanjeevgaru?

Having such a Secretary is blessing for this generation. He should continue. He's in the right place I believe.



FACE TO FACE C Z.O - II

e started his life as a post graduate teacher in Telugu in one of the schools in the second zone and rose up to be a competent Zonal Officer offering the best possible services to the students and the teachers. He maintains a good coordination between the principals and the head office officials. Read the feelings of Sri. M.Pullaiah, Zonal Officer-II and know more about what he does for students and teachers.



Sir, could you disclose details of your family, your schooling and your college education?

I hail from Kappalabandam village of Khammam district. I had a humble background. My parents depended on agriculture for livelihood. And, I had my schooling at Kappalabandam and Intermediate education at Kallur. Later on I went for B.Com graduation in Khammam.

What prompted you to join the Society? In what cadre did you enter the Society?

While I was doing M.Phil in Telugu at Osmania University, I got a posting order from the APSWREI Society appointing me as a P.G.T in Telugu. I left my M.Phil and joined as a PGT in the Society. It has been my fascination to serve the underprivileged ever since I was a student leader at the university. As a first generation learner, I have a better idea of the problems of first generation learner and joined the Society as P.G.T (Tel) on March 18th, 1986 at Kallur.

How long have you been working as a Zonal Officer? Do you regard this as a challenging job?

First, I had worked from 2010 August to 2011 February as an acting Officer (in charge) of Zone-II. Later I was appointed a Zonal Officer on January 21st 2013. Since then, I have been discharging my duties with undivided

attention. As an administrator, I am tough, democratic and attentive to the needs of the teachers. If the present Secretary had come to the society earlier, much better benefits would have been reaped. I am thankful to him and feel it a privilege to work with him and implement his ideas and vision. The Society in fact owes a great to his services.

Could you share any of your eventful incidents with the students?

Once, I had an opportunity to visit Kuntamukkala Girls institution along with our Secretary. There, we observed Ms. Divya of Senior Intermediate address the students with her brilliant English. Similarly, there was another girl named Ms. Krishnaveni in Sr. Intermediate who civilized pupils to realize their responsibilities. Such talented students need to be tapped at the right time. Our secretary is putting relentless efforts to draw them out.

What efforts are made to enhance the English Language skills in children?

Introducing English medium in the society is a landmark decision. English is a skill subject and shouldn't be taught as a mere subject. To improve communication skills in English, E-plus club activities are implemented right from 5th standard. Speaking in in English in the classroom should be made compulsory. Teachers should also develop their communication skills. Even the failures in science subjects are due to the lack of Basic English skills in students.

How can we cope with the systematic reforms taken up for the all-round development of the students?

Activity based teaching, child-centered education need patience and efforts on the part of teachers and students as well. Our pupils are mostly first generation learners and some schools run short of computers. The data teaching aids play an important role in making pupils understand the concepts better. Our teacher and students should prove that they are inferior to none in making use



of e-materials. In due course, I am hopeful that we can cope well with these changes in education and teaching.

Would you like to talk about some of achievements you accomplished as a teacher or as a principal or as an officer?

The institutions where I had worked earlier had been deprived of basic amenities like drinking water, greenery and pakka buildings. As a committed principal, I converted these institutions into sound institutions. As an officer too, I constantly monitored the institutions and solved the problems.

As a principal I have personally monitored the day study hours and night study hours and allotted my time for the benefit of students. In that process, my family welfare has been ignored. But I feel proud that my students are in good positions now and give the credit to my sacrifice.

How can good administration help the teachers?

Administration is basically fact finding and not fault finding. The talents of the teachers are to be identified by the officers. If proper supervision and motivation is there, the administration becomes easy. Strategic plans, lesson

plans etc. are for the readiness of teachers. They should not feel the planning as a burden.

What measures do you suggest to improve the quality in education?

Teachers should act as facilitators. Because of the socioeconomic barriers, our students need maximum support from the teachers. Creative thinking, reasoning, problem solving abilities and group discussion should be made part and parcel of the curriculum. Teachers can also make use of the reliable resources on the internet. Many teachers have no acquaintance with the latest academic techniques.

Do you think the present evaluation system is reliable?

I think the present system of Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) reduces the fear complex. It is the best alternative to prevent students from attempting suicides. Though a pupil is not good at academics, he/she can show his talent in his chosen ways of learning. Getting marks in the examinations is not the criteria. But, the teacher has to identify the areas of backwardness, strengths and guides them in a right direction.






TWO BODIES ... ONE SOUL



hen he was a village lad, he roamed around the fields, played with cattle. He also went up the hills, and watched the grazing sheep. Yet he did not stay away from school. Though he was poor, he was never poor in studies. He was the first in the school. Neeradi Rajanna started his life with agriculture and became an expert in studies of Sheep. He is the first Veterinary Professor from his village.

To know more about him, the SWAEROES approached him and he gives a detailed account of his career growth.

Q. Hello! Sir, we are happy to know that you studied in the APSWREIS. Please tell us briefly about your childhood?

A: Welcome! I was born and raised in a remote village called Velpur in Nizamabad. I am the son of Mr. N. Rajanna (Late) and Mrs. Thara, who were the tillers of land. I was brought up in poor environment, yet, I always wanted to go to school.

I had my primary education in a government school at Velpur and proved myself a hardworking student. **Even**

when I was in VII class I was awarded a merit scholarship at district level.

Later, I joined APSWR School, Uppalwai for my secondary education. There, I got *Telugu Vignana Parithoshikam* for two years. I was interested in games and sports as much as in my studies. I played sports and games and participated Volley ball and Kabaddi in the state level under 16 years.

Q: Great! A good combination of physical and mental fitness! What about your college education?

A: For doing intermediate I left for Hyderabad to study in *Chaithanya Kalashala*. I did my graduation with BVSc and AH (Bachelor of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry) from the College of Veterinary Science, Rajendranagar. It is a four year course.

I could not think of any other course because of the poor financial status of my mother. Yet, I stood second in the college during first and second year of my graduation.

Then, I did my post-graduation, MVSc from Acharya N.G.Ranga Agricultural University in Hyderabad.

Q. Did you go for a job in Veterinary Science?

A. Yes, after my post-graduation, I joined as a Veterinary Assistant Surgeon at Veterinary Dispensary at Bhiknoor in Nizamabad. I worked there for four years. I was awarded the "Best Veterinary Doctor" in the district.

What did you do after that?

Well, I resigned the job as I got a better one. I got posted as an Assistant Professor in the Acharya N.G. Ranga Agricultural University at Rajendranagar.

Q: Briefly explain about your Ph.D? What did you do after Ph.D?

A: I did my Ph.D on sheep and their growth. I was given a National Best Poster Award and 2 prizes for my Ph.D. presentations. After my Ph.D, I was promoted as an Associate Professor and posted at the College of

Veterinary Sciences, Korutla. I also worked as a Farm Manager at College of Veterinary Sciences, Hyderabad.

Q. What are the prospects to work in Veterinary Sciences?

A: For early and happy settlement, Veterinary Science is the best. There are plenty of job opportunities in this field. I advise Swaeroes to go for this best option.

Q. What do you know about the present status of the APSWREI Society? What is your message to our Swaeroes?

A: As a former student of the Society, I am always curious about the happenings in the Society schools. I really appreciate the series of reforms taken up by Dr. R.S. Praveen Kumar, Secretary. Such reforms can change the face of the nation. My message to my Swaeroes is that "As long as you work hard, no field is barren."

I really congratulate you on your outstanding work in the field of veterinary science and hope you will reach the pinnacle of success in the years to come.
