

Manjunath Swaero, IRS



agadi Manjunath was a son of peasant parents. He was born and brought up in Kothakonda village of Chittoor. His parents were illiterates. They didn't have any land. Therefore, they were bound to work as agricultural labourers in their own village. There was no way out for them except working in the fields for others. Manjunath's siblings were also illiterates. Most part of their life was led in sheer poverty. "There were times when good food was a rarity in our house," says Manjunath.





The house he refers to was a mere hut. Every rainy season left them with sleepless nights. The stormy winds would frequently ruin the roof of the hut. "Usually, the farmers love rains, they wait for showers, but as a boy I would always despise rain because it created havoc in our family," adds Manjunath.

Even under the miserable conditions, he was sent to school. He somehow managed to pass 10th Class. But he worked hard and got first class. His parents wanted him to go for either tailoring or weaving. But he says that he was on the look-out for an institution that could offer him free food and education.

Within the reach was APSWRS/Jr.College, B.Kothakonda. Mr.Vasudeva Rao, Lecturer in Economics extended his hand when everything was going wrong. Once he got admission, he got a good support from his seniors and then from the teachers like Mr.Prabhakar, Mr.Rangaswamy. He was also in the good books of the principal, Mr. Ravindranath because of his hard work. Manjunath says that he is inspired by every one of them owing to their many positive traits.

Mr. Ravindranath is an inspiration for honesty, Mr.Prabhakar for his discipline. Mr. Rangaswamy has been his favourite teacher. It is he who taught him English and inspired him to think big. He also trained him to speak well in elocution competitions. For whatever communicational skills he has today, he says, it is because of Mr. Rangaswamy. He also says that Mr Balaji Naidu, another guru inspired him to go to Delhi. "I still can't forget Mr. Vasudeva Rao asking me to stand by the poor and do justice," recalls Manjunath.

However he says that the Silver Jubilee College in Kurnool provided him a right platform and the seniors there propelled him to think about and work for achieving Civil Service examinations. But then says Manjunath "I always stood among the best students in terms of good habits and discipline. I believe friends are makers or breakers of our lives. Good friends help us to reach good heights and the bad pull us down."

Generally many students who are not well exposed to the ways of achieving success in civil service examinations and banking tests tend to think that they can be cracked only by students with sound academic background. He inspires the budding Swaeroes by saying "Every average student, even below average students, with a strong determination can easily achieve the success. Most of the selected ones are average or below average when they were in schools and colleges." He says that he had been a Telugu medium student till the completion of his graduation. Though he didn't have any money, he prepared for the examinations. Now-a-days, gathering of materials for any of the highest jobs is very easy. He says that he is ready to provide any materials from his side for those who are serious about preparation.

Face to Face with Zonal Officer-III



PARENTS FIRST MEETING AT GUNTUR: \$.2.2014

Sir, would you briefly tell us about your family and education?

I was born in Gudipudi village of Bapatla mandal in Guntur district. My parents are Sri Venkatappaiah and Smt. Rathnavathi. Both of them are illiterates and depended on agriculture for their livelihood. My schooling was done in Gudipudi and Appikatla villages. My college eduction was done Prakasham and Guntur districts. I did B.Ed from Kurnool under S.V. University. For



M.Sc (Botany) I went to Nagarjuna University. My M.Ed was done from Osmania University. I am proud to say that I am the first postgraduate from SC community from our village.

What inspired you to get into the Society and in what cadre you entered the Society?

Since I came from an agricultural family I know well what kind of life the poor lead. Right from my childhood I had concern for the poor and fortunately I got an opportunity to serve the poor and the oppressed. Ever since I entered the Society as PGT (Botany) I have also got to look after the institution as an In-Charge Principal. Thus, I have started playing a simultaneous role of an academician and administrator. This gave me to have a comprehensive outlook on the functioning of the institutions.

What had been your memorable experiences as a Principal?

Though there are many memorable incidents, the first one had been when my students secured 100% first class result from APSWR School, Asifabad in Adilabad district, which was the place of my first appointment. Working as

Principal in Shaikpet also gave me greater satisfaction, because I could bring in lot of reforms such as procuring MPLAD funds, preparation of Model Menu of Diet, introducing long time coaching for IIT aspirants etc. within my capacity. The up gradation was not taken up till 1994. But, with the support of the authorities, up gradation started in the year 1995 which benefitted the downtrodden. I am content with the up gradation. I have a long list of my achievements there.

Did you have any regrets having been a Principal for a pretty long time?

I should say that I am practical in every sense; there was no question of any regrets. I always enjoyed the support of my superiors and the coordination of my colleagues. Nothing benefits the institutions as much as team work. Instead of regretting, I would come out with better solutions for every problem.

What milestones have been reached by you as a Zonal Officer?

Being at the helm of affairs at the zone level is not that easy. Yet I never was at rest. I visited all the problematic institutions at first to make out the problems from different ends. There are three districts in our zone and 52 institutions including KGBVs.

Which role is better liked by you, a teacher, a Principal or a Zonal Officer?

For me the best of all is to be a teacher. As a teacher you could be straight away in touch with the students. Millions of minds are changed by a teacher. But, for a man of commitment every role is important in its own way. Changing individuals is changing society. Different

obligations in different roles help us change the set up all together.

How do you receive the changes in the last couple of years?

The reforms taken up by our Secretary for the last two years gave me a statuary support to implement all my ideas at the field level. I think our Society is buffeted by the rapidity of changes taking place in the last couple of years. Had it not been for the present Secretary, the status of students, teachers and parents would not have been as conscious as they are now. Beginning from the E-plus Clubs till the recent success of scaling Mount Everest, how many wonders have not been done? I think a literal washing up of conscience done. tace of schools is changed. Confidence level of learners shot up like never before and the students who have been dormant so far have been sparked with the help of E-Plus Clubs. How much we have achieved is not so important as how we are achieving. Every effort is taken to maintain the vigor of E-Plus Clubs by motivating teachers first.

What activities are proposed for teachers for the rapid academic progress?

The two important aspects for teachers are: maintenance of Study Diary and Continuous Performance Assessment. If the subject teachers maintain one consolidated register of 200 pages for each class and different items can be incorporated into it so that principals can monitor several things regularly in an effective manner. Secondly, the continuous assessment of the teachers especially in academic issues is very important. Report on completion of syllabus, correction of notebooks, class wise, subject wise and teacher wise formats would be more effective.

What suggestions would you like to make for the quality education?

For the quality of education, right from the principal to the last teacher, everyone should stick to his job chart, and it should be scrupulously followed for achieving the goals from time to time. The students, the teachers and the parents should realize their responsibilities. Discipline can bring all the change expected by us.





In less than a week, M. Poorna (14) and and acclimatisation in November last Anand Kumar (17), two students from State-run residential schools, will undertake what could be the most arduous journey of their lives. The duo, under the guidance of well known mountaineer Shekhar Babu, will attempt to conquer 'Chomolungma', the Mount

If they succeed Poorna will become the youngest Indian to have achieved the feat. "The 72-day expedition starting from April 4 will take the north route, i.e. the Nepal-China route," said Shekhar Babu, from the Transcend Adventures here at a press conference.

The Hyderabad based company, which manages a rock climbing school at Bhongir in association with AP Tourism Development Corporation (APTDC), trained over 100 youngsters in November and chose Poorna and Anand among them for the expedition. Poorna, a class nine student, and Anand, an intermediate firstyear student, underwent rigorous training

year, when they visited Mount Kanchenjunga region, where they climbed Mount Renock, which is at 17,000 feet above the sea level.

"The primary aspects to consider were their physical and mental health apart from their ability to adapt to extreme climates. Of the 150 rock climbers we chose, these two were the best," said Parmesh Kumar, chief instructor, Rock Climbing School.

"My parents were worried but thanks to the hard training, they now have confidence in me. I am happy that I was chosen for this expedition," says Anand. On the other hand, Poorna's father was more than happy and encouraged her to take up mountaineering.

The duo are also in very safe hands, as Mr. Babu, who is the leader of the expedition, was the first Indian to climb Mount Everest as an individual, and was the recipient the Tenzing Norgay National Adventure Award.

TOUGH TIMES TILTED (An Autobiography)

"I am a true Swaero in word and deed".

I am Mr. B. Balarami Reddy, born on 11th September 1965 in Mangapuram village, Prakasham dist.

For most of my life, I lived in the company of Swaeroes. This gives me the right to claim that I'm a distinct Swearo myself.

It was sheer poverty and the loss of my father, Koti Reddy that drove me to take shelter and study in Social Welfare hostel, at the age of 13. With two siblings younger to me, I was in the 7th class then. I still remember how my mother mourned over the death of my blessed father. With almost nothing to nourish on, my mother sought the help of my relatives. One of my uncles, Mr. Veeraswamy Reddy, rescued my family, as a messenger of my deceased dad. Being the eldest, I was first put in the Social Welfare hostel, Podili in Prakasham dist where I did my studies from the 8th standard to Intermediate. I received there insufficient food, a pair of free uniform and books, and an amount of Rs.7 as cosmetic charges which my mother couldn't afford those days. My two siblings too later found these S W hostels as their abode and study and sustenance. Thus the three of us are really proud to be Swaeroes without any regrets.

It was there that I saw several swaeroes. I knew nothing of untouchability, servility, oppression, or injustice. I only knew that such a hostel was for the poor children, like me. I mingled easily with my peers and made them friends for life. I ate with them, slept with them, played with them, studied with them, and even today, as a teacher at 50, live with them and their kith and kin.

One of my classmates of those days, Mr. P. Ramesh Babu, Headmaster of Govt. High School of Ramalingapuram is still my sincere chum.

Ramesh Babu's testimony: "Balaram Reddy is my long-time acquaintance. He was a bright student from the beginning. We often recollect the days we did spend in the hostel and

meet other Swaeroes too. He's also a reasonable analyst and a genuine critic. He is also a model teacher that deserves rewards and awards in its true sense."

After succeeding in Intermediate and B.A. in SVKP Degree College at Podili, I was skeptical about the future. Aware of my financial position, my goal was set on a teacher's profession. I was able to find job immediately in a private school for a year, and then secure a place in this APSWREI Society as TGT of S.S. in 1990. My first appointment was to SWRS, Uppalwai, Nizamabad dist and am today back in my native zone as PGT after completing M.A. from Osmania University. Now I continue to work at Chillakur, Nellore dist comfortably. I take care of my mother, and my siblings too are well settled. We are thus indebted to SW Ministry is live in our memories.

Since then I have been working as a teacher for the past 23 years imparting quality education to the underprivileged Swaeroes who study in these Social Welfare Residential schools. I consider them as my Swaero brothers.

I participated in LEAD INDIA programme and trained many students for it. I also take active part in National Festivals. I train the students in co-curriuclar and extra-curricular activities. One of my students, Master Swaroop gained first prize in National level Folk Dance contests held at Dhoonthan, Kolkata.

I have been selected for the **Best Teacher Award** this year and received it at the Lalithakalathoranam on 28th January. It was indeed an unforgettable occasion taking the award from the three eminent personalities (Chairman, Vice-chairman, and Secretary). I am greatly elated to receive this award and I express my deep gratitude to our Secretary for his encouragement. This award makes me a proud teacher.

As a SWAERO I proudly say that it is a great privilege to me to serve the students who are studying (like me) in the S W Residential Schools and Colleges. I hope that I will continue to serve with the same spirit till the end.

ORIENTATION PROGRAMME FOR TEACHERS OF HINDI



n in service Training Programme for a group of 47 Teachers in Hindi was conducted by Central Institute of Hindi, Hyderabad from 23.12.2013 to 03.01.2014. The Programme which commenced with a prayer song was inaugurated by Smt. Madhulatha, DS (Academic) and the Regional Director, Prof. Shankuntalamma Reddy welcomed all the Participants.

APSWREI Society has expanded special schools under the banner Centers of Excellence in order to execute a unique style of pedagogic advancement for the marginalized sections of the Society. Accordingly the three regions in the erstwhile Andhra Pradesh – Telangana, Rayalaseema, and the coastal region have been provided with one such institution.

These Centers of Excellence are distinct from the rest in several ways. Students who are bright or, otherwise who deserve admission into corporate schools but can't afford, are recruited through an entrance test into the 5th class, and they continue to study until Intermediate.

One such school has been in progress since 2006 in Visakhapatnam. The poor parents of this region consider this school as an endowment for their children.

On a particular Sunday, it being the day of visit for parents, Mr. Apparao drove past his auto into the campus this CoE, Vizag. He usually comes alone to see his son, but this time his wife, Narayanamma too accompanied him with her other two children. Being an astute, I hesitated no longer. Swaeroes are supposed to be pro-active, and so my chat with them runs thus

Is this Auto your own Mr. Apparao?

Yes sir, I bought it on bank loan.

How many children do you have Narayanamma?

Three. One daughter and two sons. Tejaswini, this is my youngest son Ganesh, this is your Student Master. Chandu.

Where do they study?

My daughter, Tejaswini studied from 5th to Intermediate in your Meghadrigadda SW residential school successfully. She is doing her B.Tech. now.

My eldest son, Chandu is here in CoE, Vizag with you.

The youngest one, Ganesh too secured an admission into your SW residential magnet school in Srikrishnapuram.

Thus my three children are your products.

But what do they speak to you about our schools?

Oh, they keep speaking a lot this year. My two sons wrangle with each other, claiming each of their schools to be better than the other. They talk about lot of activities and their participation in them. And my daughter says that she was not exposed to these new activities during her days.

What's your impression then?

Admirable indeed. I see something new and good is





happening in the schools. When I see my children so active and lively, it energizes me too. Especially, my wife take delight in them. We notice a lot of improvement in these schools.

Now that you are earning on your auto, why don't you join them in private schools?

No, no, no. We are happy keeping them here. My children are doing well here. Private schools run business. I find quality education given for free here. Moreover, I'm rich because I have an auto. It's hardly enough to clear the loan. My earnings are very meager sir.

What's it that prompts you to keep your children here?

What not! All is fine. English ... English medium. My children should speak English. This is a great opportunity. We are overwhelmed when our children speak some English at home. It's my pride.

Again, the care taken by the teachers and the management is commendable.

My children get free loading and boarding, free book, free uniform, free stationery, and above all free education which I can't honestly afford otherwise. I tell you Social Welfare schools are a boon for us the poor and underprivileged SCs. Our children surely will have better future if the present tempo doesn't wane. APSWREI Society is our rescue. We are grateful to all the officers who run this Society.

How did you come to know about these schools?

I came to know about them through my friends and media. Then applied for the entrance tests for all the three. They easily secured. Luckily my son Chandu got admission here in CoE.

Do you know that our state is bifurcated?

Yes sir, I'm aware of it.

Do you have any apprehensions in this regard?

We are little worried about it. It may hamper the development and wider opportunities. Naturally, the jerk will create some disturbance both in the minds of parents and the students. We don't like this split happen in schools and colleges. Education shouldn't be affected. Some say the small states have larger opportunities. Whatever it is, the present residential education should continue for the poor.

Are you aware of the new developments in our schools?

Yes sir, for the last two years we observe a sea-change in the very functioning of our schools. The medium of education in the schools is English now. Many a novel programmes are introduced and many are in the pipeline. My son Chandu participated in the State Level Youth Parliament conducted by our Society for the first time in its history. He had been to Hyderabad to attend it. I was astonished at the manner in which the students spoke here at the Zonal level contests. My son invited me then. My son secured many prizes in various competitions. He also attended the Leadership Camp in Warangal for personality development.

He's readily available to spend time and render his services to the school. He's not only interested in his children, but also in others. Such parents are a relief to us in times of need. He's capable of motivating and leading the rest of the parents. We wish him all the best. He's our friend.

Mind with vision


Heart with passion


Mr. Santhosh Kumar gave a clear explanation of APCCA



Viharika: What makes you to be his fan?




