# SWAEROES

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**This is the story of a puny village lad who despite not knowing the 3 R's went on to become a Geoscientist in Geological Survey of India...**

**Read on to discover the biography and success journey of Gundani Ramesh Swaero who yet again proved that poverty, rural back ground and illiteracy of the parents are not a stumbling block to make one's dream come true ...**

Ramesh hails from a hamlet, Chegireddyghanapur of Mahabubnagar dist. He was born in 1985 to Santhoshi and Sailu who are mere farmers with just two acres of barren land. They were absolutely elated at the birth of a smart son, their only legal heir. His siblings are three girls, and so they raised him very tenderly despite severe famine and poverty. Their illiteracy never predicted his great destiny.

### **Turning Point**

As Ramesh reached five years of age, his parents admitted him in the primary school that they have in their village. Somehow he was able to pull through the fifth standard without the ability to read and write alphabet. Prompted by his grand-mother, Ramesh seeks admission in **Social Welfare Residential School, Pargi, Rangareddi dist.** in 1996 and receives the best part of his education under the famous faculty, as the boy himself puts it. It was here that Ramesh could read and write his own vernacular. He still remembers how easy the scholarly life

was, once he was able to discover the technicality of linguistics. This was the '**turning point**' of his life, according to Ramesh himself. He considers this as the platform for his holistic growth. He finally found the place that fashioned his future, he meditates. Nothing lacks there – abode, food, clothing, books, teachers, pocket-money, what not, all for free! He forgets his father and farm, and clings to books. The environment and curricular activities fired the desire for academic excellence in him and he decided to pursue his intermediate education in the same campus. Drowned in discipline and hardwork, Ramesh emerges easily through SSC and Intermediate from the same institution in 2003.

One of the teachers, Mr. Uday Bhasker of APSWR school compliments "**Ramesh was an obedient and hardworking student. The teachers here discovered tremendous potentiality in him. He possessed an indomitable spirit and receptiveness**".

The teachers in the Social Welfare Residential school, ignited such scientific temper in Ramesh that helped him to march forward with courage and conviction. He had no second thoughts. He knew his goal. He then joined for B.Sc. in PG College of Science, Saifabad, Hyderabad in 2003. The schooling in Telugu medium, fear of English and lack of guidance were the initial deterrents, but soon he worked his way out and succeeded in 2006.

### **A distinction**

It was here that he grabbed some English and entered the Osmania University in 2007 for P.G. after a sore in his first attempt. His taste for **M.Sc. in Applied Geology** fetched



him a **distinction** in 2009. Growing in maturity, he planned his career perfectly and decided to settle as **Geoscientist in Geological Survey of India** with the assistance of his guide Dr. Sudheer Kumar (a Scientist in Central Ground Water Board, CGWB).

### Class I Gezatted Officer

As his target was, Ramesh appeared for the **UPSC, Geologist examination** in 2010 but botched at the interview. His unquenchable thirst didn't diminish. He took this as a challenge, and battled a second time for the same examination in 2011 to exult at **248th All India Rank**. He embraced the lucrative profession at once!!

Gundani Ramesh reflects **"I owe a great part of my foundation to SW Residential School. It helped me as a ladder through which I could reach the top"**.

After his triumph at the **UPSC, Ramesh was conferred and crowned as a Gazetted Officer, Class I Geologist in GSI**. All his acquaintances are thrilled, more so his family.

Konya is a place frequented by earthquakes in Sathara dist of Maharastra. Ramesh spends two years (2009-2011) here gaining experience through NGRI, Hyderabas as a JRF (Junior Research Fellow).

Today he advances as Trainee officer at the Kothaguden coal exploration. From here, he has a long schedule until 12<sup>th</sup> November on various geological aspects like diamond, gold & mineral explorations, and geochemical mapping from south to north (Dundigal in Tamilnadu, Orissa, Himachal Pradesh).

### Future plans

Ramesh doesn't stop at this juncture, though adequate to settle with contentment. He pursues **Ph.D.** and also intends to attempt for **IAS** while working as a scientist.

### Unique nature

His face and features project the appearance of an angel. His talk and temperament are of sublimity. Refined and religious is his greeting. **He is a faithful reflex of the Social Welfare progeny**. With an exemplary character Ramesh evokes determination, discipline and devotion in his contemporary as well as succeeding generations of Social Welfares students (Swaeroes).

**"Ramesh is unique in every sense. He's preeminently humble and honest"**, remarks his sweetheart, Rani.

Today, Ramesh is a contented man living happily with his wife, Rani and his son, Sayudh. Ramesh attributes his accomplishments to the prayers and blessings of his parents and the encouragement and guidance of his teachers. Ramesh wins renown and regard of whoever he

chats with. He manifests in himself **truth, goodness and beauty**.

### A message

**"If I can, why can't you?"** asks Ramesh.

Ramesh enkindles his juniors saying, **"SW Residential Schools are quite apt for the weaker and downtrodden. One can benefit the maximum without having to pay a penny. Today's swaeroes have the utmost comforts which I didn't have those days. The able and just officer like Dr. R.S. Praveen Kumar, IPS, the present Secretary of the Society works sincerely for the progress of the SC/ST communities"**.

Further he appeals the swaeroes never to indulge in unwanted activities and to labour for their own success as they have the potential and are inferior to none.

**"If my success story inspires the young Swaeroes and propels them to make a difference in their lives, one page in the SWEAEROES magazine will not be sufficient but many more in future"**, adds Ramesh before he signs off.

Gundani Ramesh is the darling of many today. He's the first graduate of his native place. He's very dear to the APSWREI Society too. He remains a **faithful product of the APSWREI Society by his visits and chats**. He has a special word of appreciation for **Dr. R.S. Praveen Kumar, Secretary, APSWREIS** for inventing the '**Swaeroes X Commandments**' which enable the students to go cosmos and heroes.

Ramesh reiterates, **"It's the APSWREI Society and the teachers that have given me a life"**.

Ramesh reaches out to all consistently making headlines with success, and ensconces a place in the media.

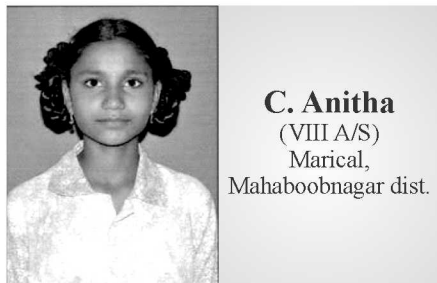

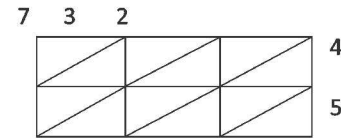
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## LATTICE MULTIPLICATION

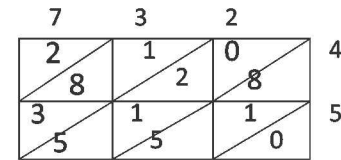
**Ex:- Multiply 732 by 45**

**Step 1:** Draw a Lattice and arrange the numbers as given

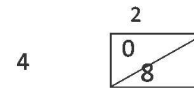


Draw as many columns as the digits in first number ; and as many rows as in second number.

**Step 2:-** Start multiplying. Begin from extreme right, from the closest numbers.



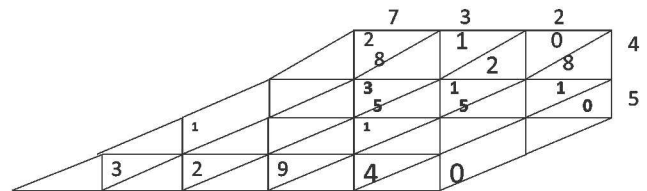
If the product is only one digit, a zero is placed in the triangle above the diagonal in the square.



When the product is two digits, the first digits goes above the diagonal and the second digits goes on the lower right of the diagonal.



**Step 3:-** Add along the diagonals. Begin with the lower right diagonal to get the final product.

### THE FIRST CARDIOLOGIST among swaeroes

**D**r. A. Prakash, a Cardiologist today was one of my students in Uppalwai Residential school. I remember him to be an expert volleyball striker. He used to leap and smack the ball down to the earth.

Locating the Narayana Hrudayala Hospital at Jeedimetla, I sat there sneezing the disinfectant odours, visualizing the stature of the physician, different from his boyhood, when I taught him in his tenth standard.

After awhile, I saw a tall person in a full handed white coloured apron with a large collar, a torch stethoscope over his shoulders, and covered with surgical suite. He just peeped out at his visitors, not paying attention to me.

I moved to the doors of his chamber and saw him sitting in his chair, examining a child.

I marched towards the table. He peeked at me, smiled and pointed the chair. After easing and comforting the kid, he politely said, "I recognize you ... how are you sir?" I felt trapped as the greeting was gratifying. I responded his greeting and expressed my bliss on seeing him as a cardiologist. We then had a relaxed chat amidst his reassuring healing touch to the ones who came in the queue. I kept on looking at those tough hands turned tender!

 • **Could you tell us about your nativity and family.**

I belong to Banjara (ST) community. My native place is Puppalapalli thanda in Nizamabad district. My parents, Sri. Bheekya Naik and Smt. Dhooribai are farmers. I have three elder brothers and four sisters. My wife, Dr. Sailaja is MD – Gynecologist. I have two cute daughters, Prajwalika and Laxmi.

• **What about your primary school education?**

There was no school in our thanda, We went to the nearby village, Sikindrapur for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> classes. For 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> classes I went to S.T. Hostel in Dichpally village.

• **Where and how did you happen to join SWR school?**

This was the turning point of my life. I had joined APSWR school, Uppalwai of Nizamabad district in 6<sup>th</sup> class. My elder brother, A. Shanker was already there studying 10<sup>th</sup> class. He guided me in writing the entrance test, and that's how I was able to study in the SW Res. School which I still consider as blessed place as it has brought life into my life. Today's position is the gift of the teachers that guided me those days. I also consider the Uppalwai school as a temple of real education.

My younger sister, Mrs. Suryakala too had studied in APSWR school, Dhamaram after me in my family. Thus it's the SW Res. Schools that have given us a lift in life.



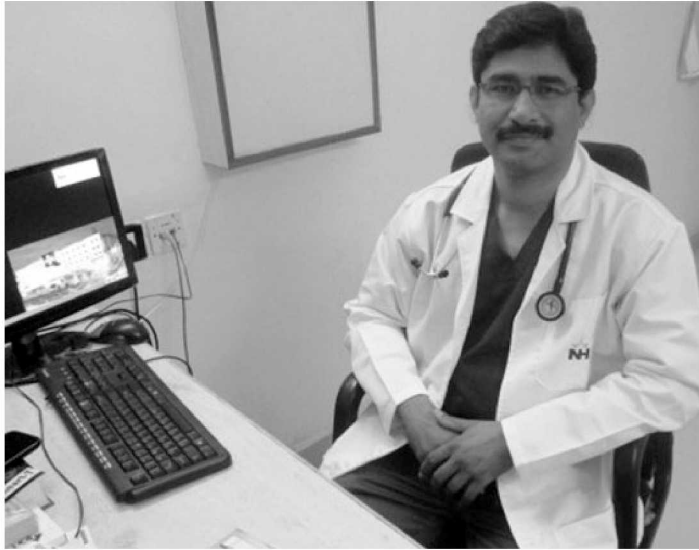

• **How did you get into medicine? Who was your inspiration?**

I was good in Mathematics but fate decided medicine for me through Mr. S.K. Mannan, Physical Director and my mentor who brought an application form for me to admit me in APRJC. I got admission into Intermediate B.P.C. I was given admission in APRJC, Hindupur, Ananthapur district. There I was succeeded in getting an admission to Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad. My inspiration and guide in seeking medicine was Dr. Ashok, Gandhi Medical College who was the first batch student of APSWR school, Uppalwai, and Dr. Poshanna in OMC.

• **Do you believe that SWR had laid a strong foundation for your growth? Could you elaborate?**

I firmly believe that SWR laid a very strong foundation for my entire career and its success. When I joined 6<sup>th</sup> class in SWRS, I was bright, but I couldn't top some others. I was the captain of Volleyball team. This was again because I was a volleyball player in Uppalwai school. This earned me many friends and easy accessibility to the seniors as well as the professors in medical college. After MBBS, I joined MD in Kakatiya Medical College. Then I got married and my wife, Dr. Sailaja encouraged me to do superspecialization in Cardiology. I am lucky and proud to say I am the first CARDIOLOGIST from "SWAEROES". I am eager to see many more superspecialists from "SWAEROES"

• **What are you doing now and how do you fare in the profession?**

I am a consultant Cardiologist to 'NARAYANA HRUDAYALAYA HOSPITALS GROUP' in Hyderabad which is 600 hundred bedded multi-superspeciality hospital. It has branches all over India and abroad too. I do all interventional procedures like CAG, PTCA STENTING, DEVICE CLOSURES. The happiest thing is that I treat many parents of our swaeroes.

• **What is your opinion about forming 'SWAEROES' Association? How do you wish to contribute to it?**

I salute Dr. R.S. Praveen Swaero, IPS, for this initiation. It is a wonderful thought from great people like him. I am **Gyara Swathi**. I was born on 10<sup>th</sup> November 1990 in Mutharam village, Palakurthy mandal, Warangal dist. My parents are Ms. Laxmi and Mr. Gyara Maisaiah. We are six siblings. I have four sisters and a brother, and I'm the 4<sup>th</sup> one. Although I was born in a poor family where my parents work for wages, they took care of me and wanted to educate me.

My parents sent me to the Primary school in my village where I studied till 5<sup>th</sup> class. I then sought admission into 6<sup>th</sup> class in the APSWR school, Parkal and studied there till Intermediate. Studying in this school was a great gift to me. I was very lucky to get an admission into it. My parents had no capacity to pay either for my education or for my maintenance. I received all for free at this school. I owe my deep gratitude to this Society. I had the flair for study and this was recognized by the teachers there.

My sister and her husband were my guardians, in fact. They used to visit me frequently and encourage me. The teachers there told them to take care of my higher education as I was brilliant in studies. My only ambition to study medicine took deep roots in my mind as the teachers inspired me with career guidance. I used to think that it would remain as a dream! But somewhere in the heart of my heart, there was a sign of its possibility.

One day I revealed the inner desire to my sister and to my brother-in-law. They were not rich either. My eldest sister who works as ANM persuaded them to help me. Finally they all decided to provide me EAMCET as I was adamant. I attended long term coaching in Vijayawada and secured 5198<sup>th</sup> rank. I didn't get the admission into MBBS. Somehow, I was not willing to give up. I had a ray of hope. I

made another attempt convincing my sisters. And it clicked. This time I could secure **2198<sup>th</sup> rank to my surprise! I got the admission in Govt. Siddhartha Medical College, Vijayawada.** This was the turning point of my life. My effort worked like a miracle.

Many people discouraged my brother-in-law and my sister when I didn't secure admission in the first attempt. The next problem was paying fees and buying books. One of my school teachers of SW Res. School understood my situation and helped me financially to purchase books. I'm very grateful to her today for such a charitable gesture.

**Today, I'm in my 3<sup>rd</sup> year medicine. I'm still in need of help. I borrow books and notes from my friends and seniors. My brother-in-law works in a footwear. He has a great concern for me. He doesn't like to see me suffer. He continues to help me as much as possible. In fact, I guess that he runs a footwear just to support me. Realizing this, I too assist him in the same footwear whenever I find time. I'm not ashamed to do it. I consider it as labor of dignity. It's a necessity.**

I long to become a **Paediatrician**. As I work hard with a goal in my mind, I'm sure I'll succeed.

It's the Social Welfare teachers who infused the desire to become a doctor. My education and endeavour should influence many other poor students. I shall certainly render my services to the poor and the suffering honestly, as I now understand the agony of the poor.

**I offer sincere thanks to all those who made me what I'm today.**

with **Vimala Kumari**

**Mrs. S.E. Vimala Kumari, Principal (B-Camp, Kurnoo dist.) is one of the seniormost principals of the IV Zone. She is to be superannuated in June 2014. Dr. Rangaswamy decides to have a chat with her in order to elicit her role and some of her achievements in the schools that she had worked for. Here are a few excerpts of their CONFAB.**

**Could you tell something about yourself and your entry into APSWREIS.**

I had joined the Society as PGT of Physical Sciences in the year 1984 and was placed in Kuntamukkala school of Krishna dist. My husband worked in Andhra bank as a Branch Manager and is now retired. We have two children and both are well settled.

I also worked as Jr. Lecturer in a govt. college before joining this Society. I was also selected as Lecturer of Physics by a Govt. Polytechnic college in Guntur. But inspired by my father who worked as Tahsildar, I decided to remain in Social Welfare Residential schools in order to serve these downtrodden and put in my share. My father told me that the Providence would bless us abundantly when we work for the development of the SC community especially. He was happy over my decision.

**When were you promoted as Principal and where all did you work?**

I worked as Special Officer at Koilakuntla before I was promoted as Principal in 1995. The places I worked as regular Principal from then on are B-Camp (Kurnool dist) in 1995, Wyra (Khammam dist) 1995-96, Chinnatekuru (Kurnool dist,) in 1996, Chinnachowk (Kadapa dist,) in 2000-2002, Nagarjunasagar-VP South (Guntur dist) in 2002, C.Belagal (Kurnool dist,) in 2002-2007, Laxmapur (Kurnool dist) in 2007-2012 and in B.Camp now.



**What are the highlights of your tenure as Principal ?**

I boast of organizing the Independence Day celebration in 1993 in Kurnool stadium when the then Chief Minister, Sri. Kotla Vijayabhaskar Reddy visited the place. His compliments and the certificate of appreciation given to me remains still as a treasure.

**Do you have anything to say about the Society ?**

The APSWREIS continues to impart the best to the rural poor. It's a great project initiated by the government of A.P. Most of our alumni are in happy positions now, or else they would have been working as labourers. Society is blessing to them.

In my entire service, I haven't seen such holistic growth among our students as is now under the authorship of Dr. R.S. Praveen Swaero. What a man he is!! No language is adequate to describe his efforts. His is the brilliant tenure so far, I say.

## Face to Face with HIMABINDU and her MOTHER

*Himabindu is a swaero studying tenth class in the SWRS, Amaravathi, Guntur dist. The Zonal Officer of 3<sup>rd</sup> Zone, the Convener of Guntur dist. and the Principal of Amaravathi school often speak high of this girl. Therefore I longed to have a chat with this girl and her parents. As I entered the Amaravathi school, I noticed everyone busy like bees.*

*There ... they were – Himabindu and her mother, Sunitha. I greeted them instantly and went ahead talking to Sunitha thus:*

### **How are you Sunitha? Tell me something about yourself.**

I'm fine sir. I live in Upplapadu village near Guntur. It's 50 kms away from Amaravathi. My husband Pothaiah and I are tailors. We have a son and two daughters. My son works as a mason as we couldn't afford educating him after his tenth. My eldest daughter, Manisha studied here itself from fifth to eighth class and gave up. She's now married and works for wages. Our only hope now is this girl, Himabindu.

### **What do you expect her to be?**

I have no idea as I'm illiterate. We only encourage her to study. We quote the examples of many others who have earned a position through education. She's intelligent and is able to understand our financial stringencies and poverty. She's wise and is capable, as I perceive. If she's earnest, you teachers are there to guide her. She shouldn't labour for wages as her siblings do. We only expect her to live decently.

### **Himabindu, do you understand your mother's aspirations? Will you fulfill them?**

Of course, I do understand her agony and aspirations. I'm equally determined. I won't give up my education like my brother and sister. I know I'm intelligent. I study well and it has been acknowledged by my teachers. My life will not be miserable, I'm sure.

### **What makes you so confident?**

My mentors have selected me to teach on Mana TV as 'Super Student'. I've performed very well. SWR schools are different now. I study in English medium now. I read newspapers, books, attend Voice for Girls, etc. Teachers enlighten us now about future. My mind is now set on study. All this give me confidence that I will one day make my parents happy.

### **What exactly is your goal?**

As of now, my aptitude and strength is Biological science, although I'm good in Mathematics too. I aspire to become a doctor.

### **What efforts do you make to become a doctor then?**

I love nature. I watch plants, animals and birds. I collect such live models to explain lessons to my fellow students as I'm a teacher assistant. I keep searching for scientific queries in newspapers and books.

### **How do you feel after listening to your daughter now, Sunitha?**

It gives me a lot of hope. She's smart and she can do it. I'm pleased to hear her speak English.

### **Have you seen her on Mana TV ?**

Yes, we were informed about the schedule. It was thrilling. My eyes were blinded as I saw her on the TV. Her father is very proud of her. Secretary sir gave her Rs.1000 which she has given to her father.

### **Are you then satisfied educating her in SWR school?**

Of course. We pay nothing. On the contrary, all is given her free. We notice the valid changes that take place in this school now. I visit Himabindu frequently and she narrates many things about her school. She says that she's admired by all teachers here and she's a leader too. What else do we poor illiterates want when all is well!

We are absolutely happy with the school and the care given to the girls.

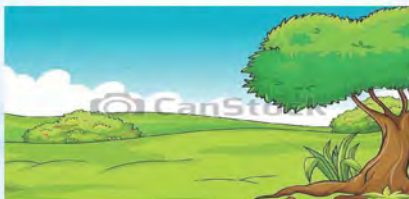

**A**fter a thrilling triumph of summiting Mt. Reynock, Social Welfare Residential School students left for Leh to summit Mt. Stok Kangri (6,153 mts) this time. Our team consisted of nine swaeroes and a Physical Edn Teacher. We were given an affectionate send off by Dr.R.S. Praveen Kumar, Secretary on 25<sup>th</sup> evening along with the SWAEROES flag.

Guided by Mr. Shekharbabu, Mr. T. Sridharan and me Mr. Parmesh Kumar belonging to Transcend Adventures Pvt. Ltd. headed for Leh-Ladakh for winter mountaineering expedition on 26<sup>th</sup> Dec. The students were taken to Leh-Ladakh as per phase 3 of OP Everest to test their endurance, physical and mental fitness apart from their cold bearing capacity and sustainability in high altitudes and extreme cold temperature. On reaching Delhi, we reported, registered and obtained permission at the IMF (Indian Mountaineering Foundation), and flew by 'GO AIR' to Leh on 28<sup>th</sup> Dec. "It was terribly freezing. I was scared of the health the girls and their endurance. But they were as strong as boys" says Srilatha, their teacher.

We spent three days in Leh for acclimatization. We planned to move to Stok Kangri base camp on 1<sup>st</sup> January but the heavy snowfall prevented our advancement. The snowfall didn't recede although we waited for another three there.

We then went ahead with another plan and moved to Zgmusa on 2<sup>nd</sup> Jan. We experienced severe cold of -35 degrees along with heavy wind chill at Zgmusa. We used to go for hiking on the ridges to practice rock climbing in cold temperature in order to acclimatize. We then headed to Pangong lake which lay on Indo-China border where we again experienced freezing cold, gaining a height of 17,688 feet while crossing ChangLa. We spent two hours there before we visited Pangong lake.

We then flew back for Delhi on 7<sup>th</sup> Jan and reported at the IMF. We took the girls and guys for Delhi siteseeing and returned for Hyderabad on 10<sup>th</sup> Jan. We were offered delicious meals at Bellampally by the teachers of SWR Jr. college. On reaching Hyderabad, Mr. Mannan, Sports Officer was ready to receive us with all cheer.

The children experienced the terrific chill that normally prevails in winter. All of us have returned safely without meeting any casualty. Their determination, energy, endurance and resistance hasn't faded in any way. These are our efforts to acquaint the children to fluctuating conditions of the Himalayas before we plan to summit Mt. Everest, the highest peak. They are eagerly looking for the day!

# EAMCET2013 Marks and Ranking Analysis

## Andhra Pradesh EAMCET Ranking Analysis

### How Engineering rank is allotted

The ranks are allotted based on the 75% marks achieved in EAMCET exam by a student and 25% weightage is given to the intermediate marks in group subjects to determine the rank. The marks considered from intermediate is not the 1000 marks in inter first and second year, but apart from the language marks for 400, the remaining marks a student gets for the 600 group score is aggregated for the 25 marks. It shows that every 24 marks a student scores in intermediate is given a 1 mark weightage in the EAMCET ranking.

### Check out this analysis

If we observe the marks of last year 20,000 students, there is only major difference of 50 in their marks. It means that there are many students who have scored 550 marks in the intermediate group subjects conducted for 600 marks and hence it implies that there is only 2 marks difference in the EAMCET ranking. Though there is a weightage of 25 percent marks for intermediate marks it is the EAMCET marks that actually determine the ranking of a student.

If we analyze in a different way, it is clear that if there is one mark difference in the intermediate group subject then that is going to bring in a change of 0.04167 in the inter marks weightage which determining the final rank in EAMCET. This shows that the difference of one mark in the inter may actually change only 10 to 50 ranks but not that one can actually get a better rank based on the intermarks.

### Inter Vs EAMCET

The EAMCET exam is being conducted for 160 marks and is aggregated for 75 which show that for every 2 marks a student earns in EAMCET his final weightage increases for 1 mark or else for every one mark the EAMCET student earns he gets a weightage of 0.46875 for calculating the rank.

When inter marks are compared with EAMCET marks it shows that every 14 marks in inter is equal to 1 mark earned in EAMCET. From this we can understand that priority should be given to get good marks in EAMCET than in the INTERMEDIATE marks.

### How to get a rank below 1000 in EAMCET

Let us see from last year the ranks earned by students for the EAMCET marks (total 160 marks)

For below 50<sup>th</sup> rank one has to get above 140 marks

For below 100 ranks one has to get above 136 marks

For below 500 ranks one has to get above 120 marks

For below 1000 rank one has to get above 110 marks

For below 5000 rank one has to get above 90 marks

Eamcet 2013 Inter Marks Weightage Details

**Eamcet 2013 Inter Marks Weightage details:** Most eamcet 2013 students had doubts about the amount of weight-age will Eamcet Rank analyzer. 9 total lack of students study than students through this almost 4 missing a chance to take the exam Eamcet 2013. But to the good position in Eamcet is quiet difficult unless you are prepared hard. For admission in the top 20 public and private colleges students have less than 1000 rows. In Andhra Pradesh weight age will be given to marks

Eamcet. After the ranking will be decided for students.

Eamcet will test a total of 160 points. This will be 75% and intermediate marks are considered as 25%. In the interim figures, only students are held in the branch subject. While only 600 tickets will be given in 25%. 25% of the weight of between-age classification, the decision to participate in Eamcet grade students. But rank will increase or decrease Eamcet marks. Intermediate increase does not affect the ranking. But will affect Eamcet marks the rank of the student. Intermediate in 14 points is equal to 1 in the Eamcet examination marks. So Eamcet marks will decide the ranking.

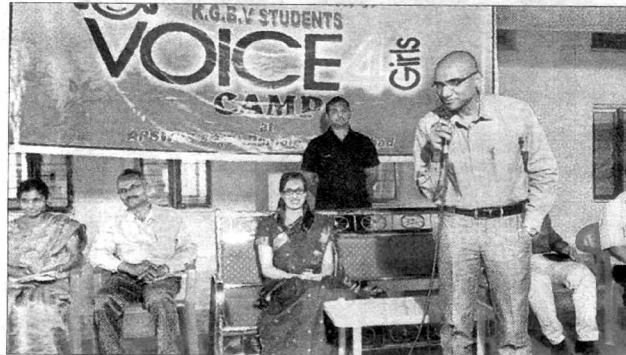

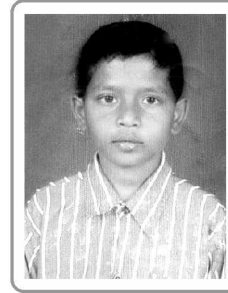

# CENTRAL SERVICES

All India Services are the most prestigious positions offered through UPSC examinations. These are the backbones of the Indian Administrative set up who wield huge power and social prestige. There are villages named after civil servants. One can imagine the kind of opportunity these posts provide to make an impact on the society, and to bring about social change. From the day one gets selected, he/she becomes power elite of the society with huge respect and stature.

Here I would like to give some **insights on preparation** for this prestigious and one of the toughest competitive exams.

This is a **three stage** selection process: **Prelims, Mains and Interview.**

**Prelims consists of two papers - General studies and Aptitude test.** Questions in **General studies** are of up to 12<sup>th</sup> class standard. It requires the basic understanding of NCERT books up to 12<sup>th</sup> class. Therefore it is advisable to read all the books released by NCERT up to 12<sup>th</sup> class. The **Aptitude Test** contains passages in English of 10<sup>th</sup> standard. This paper depends on the practice of quantitative, aptitude, reading skills and vocabulary of English. Regular reading habits is an added advantage to score in this paper. **NCERT books are the fundamental for mains preparation.**

Those who clear **prelims** are called upon to write the **main** examinations.

**Mains consists of nine papers**

i) **Two papers are to test one's language skills. English and one local language** are the two qualifying papers. Each paper consists of 250 marks. There is no special preparation required for English if one is of English medium background. Students from A.P. choose Telugu (local language) for qualifying. **Minimum reading and writing skills** are adequate to qualify in this paper.

ii) **Two are optional.** Any subject can be selected. Normally easy scoring subjects are chosen. The options like Sociology, Telugu, Geography, Psychology, Public Administration, Anthropology are favorite subjects that have high success rates.

iii) **The five General studies** papers test one's understanding of the socio economic and political conditions of the country. Essay type is used to get a sample of applicant's organizing ability, his orderly mind, lucidity, imagination and literary achievement. If one is thorough with his/her preparation of General Studies, one can attempt essay decently. Preparation for probable essays is always advisable. It is always better to follow standard text books related to the topic.

(Here I list out some **standard text books** apart from the NCERT books - Indian Heritage and Culture-NCERT, Spectrum's art and culture, Indian History-Bipin Chandra's books (both before national movement and after Independence), World History-Norman Lowe, Geography-Goh Che Leong, NCERT, Polity-Laxmikanth, International Relations, News papers and Ministry of External Affairs site, Science and Technology-spectrum's



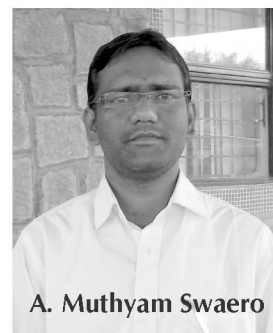

Science and Technology and CSIR's magazine, Economic Development-India Year Book, Economic Survey, and Dutt and Sundaram, Environment and Ecology-Annual Report of Ministry of Environment and forests. Disaster Management-2<sup>nd</sup> ARC report. Ethics and Integrity paper. There is no specific book as of now but I, subbarao, a retired bureaucrat wrote a book according to the syllabus, which is sufficient to start with. It is advisable to read topics of this paper from standard text books like Attitude. One should refer to Social Psychology text books. The News papers and Magazines are highly helpful in covering the recent events. The Hindu Paper, Yojana, Kurukshetra and, Economic and Political Weekly (EPW) are sufficient to master **current affairs**. EPW is difficult to comprehend to starters, but it is a worth reading weekly. One should learn to understand and analyze the socio economic and political current events from the academic perspective)

## SELECTION

Based on the marks obtained in the mains, aspirants get a call for the **interview**. Then a **Merit list** is prepared to place each of the selected candidates in the prestigious and powerful post.

**Civils preparation is a long term process.** One should develop the personality to suit it. The qualities like self motivation, perseverance, stress and emotional management, and health are equally important aspects. Swaroes have entered into premier Technical institutions like IITs and NITs. Probably it is the time to look at **Civil services** which provide ample opportunities to bring social change that our constitution envisages.

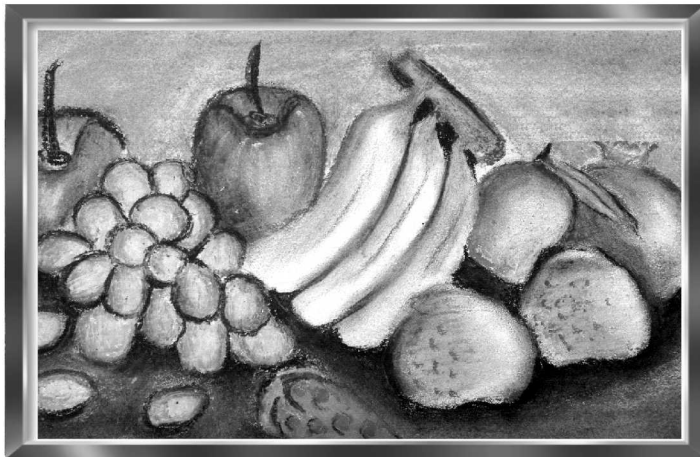

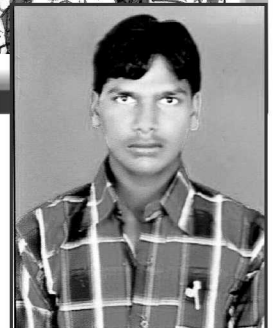
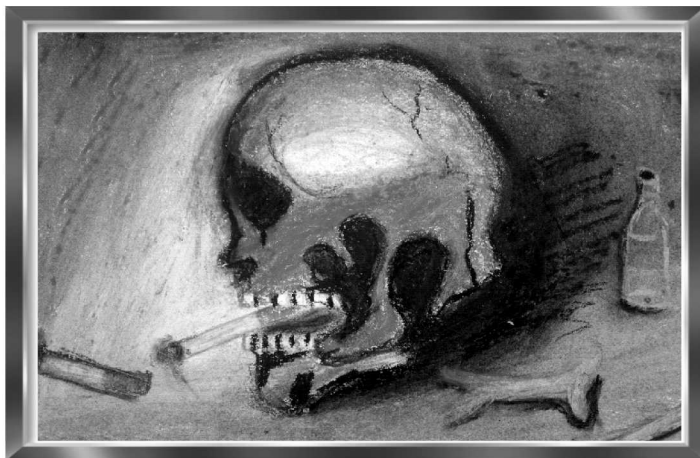
